Treasurer's Report 2022 - 2023

Accompanying this report is the Financial Statement for the New Zealand National Chrysanthemum Society for the year ending 31st March 2023



Total Income

The total Income of \$2,287.34 is made up of \$932.34 from interest, and subscriptions of \$1,355.00 (non taxable).

Interest paid on the term deposits are continuing to rise.

Expenses

The Expenses of \$2846.25 are up from last year, due to the need to purchase a computer and software for the new secretary. The loss is \$558.91.

The sum of \$738.09 was transferred from Term Deposit PN 3003 to cover the cost of the computer. This term deposit of \$11,000 was reinvested at 4%, the interest being paid monthly.

The total assets stand at \$44,887.23 with \$31,543.26 of that being the Endowment Fund.

The Society has moved to an alternative method of banking, due to the withdrawal of the use of cheques. The ramifications of these changes are still being felt, with some Members are still having difficulty dealing with Internet Banking. To make matters worse the BNZ has decided to change the method of signing into the account. They will require a smartphone to log in as from 31st July. I do not have a smartphone or a need for one. BNZ tells me there is no alternative and that Michael Coulter or Tom Dahlenburg will have to make all payments and supply me with monthly statements.

The Membership list now stands at approx 34. Approx 20 Members were struck off due to non payment of subscriptions. We have also lost the Waikato Society.

My thanks to Steve Miers for his review of the accounts.

Foliar Nematode in Chrysanthemum

How to avoid this microscopic disease

Five or six years ago when I first started growing Chrysanthemums I was puzzled by the appearance of some of the plants leaves. At the time I was growing them outside and I didn't realise such a thing as foliar nematode existed.

The symptoms are progressive and start with yellowing of the leaves particularly the older ones followed by interveinal chlorosis and dying of the leaves, eventually the whole leaf dies. In the above photos you can see the distinctive triangular dying of the leaf between the main veins.

The nematodes are microscopic and cannot be seen and are spread by rain splash or droplets.

After realising what was wrong, I have changed the way I grow my plants. I have stopped overhead watering and I use the spray Confidor or as a spray periodically which seems to work well too.

Judges Report

This years National Show was held in Invercargill with exhibitors travelling from Christchurch, Ashburton, Temuka and Mosgiel as well as the local growers. There were good entries which included some novices as well. The overall quality of entries was up to expectations with most types represented although the large exhibition continued to be down on the number of people growing them. The decorative and incurved classes were well supported with all exhibitors entering good quality blooms which made for close competition.

The new fantasy class with 9 vases of one bloom in a vase had three entries which gave competition in the multi vase class, the first time for some years. This may be a trend for other classes to follow to increase competition. The other classes of singles, anemone and sprays were shown in small numbers, some were in the special classes only. There is an opportunity for more of these classes to be grown as they add diversity to shows and growers don't need to grow many plants to achieve flowers of show quality. The container plants added plenty of colour to the show and there were some large specimens which the public liked.

The top table flowers were as good as any I have judged at previous National Shows. Congratulations to all winners and exhibitors at the show, it was a privilege to judge the show.

It was with great sadness that we took the step of closing our club after more than fifty years.

Growing and showing chrysanthemums and the fellowship that went along with it filled a big part of Peter and my lives from the early 80's. So many new friends were made through joining together to share knowledge and then to challenge each other with the results when showtime came around each year. This was at both local as well as national level.

In my early time the club was having our show in a local church hall. This meant bringing all the staging and vases into the venue, setting it all up, then staging blooms, judging or stewarding then opening to the public. After the show closed and blooms all taken down, we delivered the equipment back again. By this time everyone was very tired so we would adjourn to the nearest Pizza Hut for Sunday tea. This was always a good time of relaxation and sharing.

Waikato members had regular honours with blooms on the Champion Table including the ultimate, Champion of Champions bloom. Names that come to mind are John Thorn, Ashley Booth and Jock Sinclair as well as 'behind the scenes' essential people like Nicki and Steve Miers. Several members have also served on the NZNCS Committee, holding positions of President, Secretary, Treasurer and committee member so I feel we have "done our bit" there.

We were fortunate to have mentoring at the regular club days held during the growing season. We would meet in someone's garden and have a talk and demonstration on the care of plants. These were great days enjoyed by everyone. Summer picnics were fun as we would travel to Mt Maunganui to the Thorn's holiday home for a day out there.



Then the Hamilton Gardens project began. We helped fundraise for the new pavilion. The Club were also able to have their own garden there to plant out and care for. It was beside a public pathway near the rose gardens so had plenty of exposure to people visiting the gardens. This was also used for teaching with the added bonus of being able to have a hands-on try ourselves under the watchful eye of Ashley or John. Because of this we were able to use the facilities at the gardens to raise our own cuttings - some to plant out in the garden there and some to sell. This was a good fundraiser for us. Unfortunately plants 'disappeared' from the garden and gradually the hedge grew up there so it was discontinued.

What a treat the new Pavilion proved to be! All laid out with horticultural shows in mind and what a difference at show time with all the equipment stored right on the spot - so easy to erect and take down again. We even held our club after-show dinners there as well, with caterers bringing the food in for us. We have had outstanding committee members over the years so the club has functioned seamlessly with some members holding positions for more than 20 years! We have been able to reward these special folk with Life Membership for their loyal service.

I guess it is the people that I remember most, along with the cultivars they grew. Chrysanthemum people are special people and I am already missing the regular contact we had with each other. So it is the end of an era for the Waikato Chrysanthemum Society. There is still a core of firstclass growers here and it would be great if they could keep in contact with each other. Perhaps like the Phoenix, something will rise out of the ashes.

So - now it is time to move on with one final task left - disposing of our assets. What a wonderful time I've had and now have space to enjoy the memories as I reflect on 40 years association with the Club
